## **UNDERWAY Ronald McDonald House - Grand Rapids, MI Renovation and Expansion**



- » EV is partnering on another project for Ronald McDonald House of West Michigan. This time around we are converting a previously large, somewhat functional kitchen into two separate kitchens and a dining room. The two kitchen set-up will allow for volunteer groups to work separately from the house residents who may need some privacy. Additionally, the former barn apartment is being converted to house eight additional guest rooms.
- » Self-perform trades include demolition, sitework, firestopping, carpentry, general trades, interiors and painting.
- » Work on this project started in May and will run into December.
- » The anticipated budget for the project is \$2.0M.

# **GETTING STARTED** Next Center - Holland, MI **New Construction**



- » Also known as the Lakeshore Advantage building, the Next Center is adjacent to the EV property. Plans for this building began in March of 2020, and we are finally into the construction phase! The three-story facility will be owned and operated by Lakeshore Advantage, the economic development organization serving Ottawa and Allegan counties. Dubbed the "Next Center", it will house a business incubator, community education space and the organization's new headquarters.

- » Quality Car Wash is bringing the first of its kind detail center to the lakeshore. This site will feature the state of the art wash tunnel this community has come to love. In addition to the wash tunnel, this location will have two additional lanes for interior detailing. For the do-it-yourselfer, there will still be selfservice vacuums available for use.

Brian Piper is currently working on a Devon Self Storage project in Colorado Springs, Colorado. EV was initially awarded the demolition package for this project, but has now also secured the renovation of the building as well.

The building permit is anticipated to come the second week of February. Brian is currently working with Tony Szafranski on value engineering and finalize the design. However, the demolition permit is already in hand, so there is work that can start by the end of October. Demolition is scheduled to take four weeks to complete.

As the result of vandalism, the building has been stripped clean. The HVAC, electrical and RTU's are currently non-existent. To accommodate for future needs, the replacement of MEP's and fire suppression will begin following demolition.
