## WHAT WE'RE BUILDING

#### RECENTLY AWARDED Tyson Foods - Zeeland, MI Renovation



- » Tyson Foods is planning a renovation of Spiral Freezers 1 & 2. Tyson is replacing two of the three spiral freezers for their sausage lines. Our self-preform work will include building 200-feet of temporary wall, concrete demolition, insulated metal panel (IMP) demolition, installation of a Rytec door, painting and installing bollards. For trade partners we will manage concrete, floor brick and IMP installation.
- » Work on this project is scheduled to begin next April and will run for seven weeks.
- » This project has an approximate budget of \$816,000.

UNDERWAY Devon Self-Storage - Southfield, MI Renovation & Expansion



- » EV is managing another project for Devon Self-Storage, and this time it is in Southfield, MI. For this project, each floor is just over 32,000-SF, and there are four floors. We are also building a 3,000-SF addition onto the building for a total project square footage of 132,466. The building addition includes a climatecontrolled loading/unloading area with a small loading dock and two new elevators. The existing building was a high-end accounting and tax office that was gutted by EV earlier this year. The finished space will consist of 780 storage units of various sizes and a new leasing office. There are also plans for a commercial retail space on the first floor that may be another opportunity for EV in the future.
- » Work on this project started in October and will wrap up in early August, 2024.
- » The budget for the project is \$2.5M.

### GETTING STARTED Tommy's Express - Muskegon, MI



- » EV Construction demolished a former Golden Corral location to make way for the newest Tommy's Express. This location is our third consecutive project with this ownership team who has allowed EV to self perform and negotiate with a group of preferred trade partners.
- » Construction on this project will run until the end of July, 2024.
- » The budget for the project is \$2.8M.

### FINISHING UP Blodgett Sixth Floor - Grand Rapids, MI Renovation



- The sixth floor at Blodgett was the second phase of a three phase project. Work at the hospital started on the second floor with the renovation of the inpatient breast clinic. This phase included a 11,750-SF renovation to create new offices, conference rooms and collaborations spaces.
- » Self-perform trades on this project included steel, firestopping and general trades.
- » Work on this project started almost one year ago.
- » The total budget for this phase was about \$4.2M.

## EV ON THE ROAD

#### Colorado Springs, CO - Devon Self Storage Parker Slagh, Field Manager

Although my current situation isn't necessarily, "on the road," since it is very close to our Colorado home, but it still brings new challenges like any other placement for our travelers. Each location brings a new team of trade contractors, clients, inspectors and obstacles throughout the process of construction.

This past year has been a whirlwind of travel for me. I started the year turning over a Tommy Express Car Wash in Westland, Michigan, and then found myself completing another in Flowood, Mississippi. From there I went to Omaha, Nebraska to demolish an existing bank and strip mall. From Omaha I ventured to Charleston, South Carolina where I had the opportunity to kickoff the ground breaking on one of our three projects in that area. My time

ended in Charleston completing the Ashley Phosphate car wash, a true EV team effort there.

Currently, I am working on a Devon Self-Storage building in the heart of Colorado Springs, Colorado - the place I currently call home. The project is a full renovation and addition of an existing 64,000-SF Baby 'R' Us. There will be two additions to the existing building totaling an additional 35,000-SF. In addition to the main building there will be seven single story storage buildings. In the early stages, we have experienced vandalism and theft causing additional delays to the schedule but nothing we can't work through.

The travel life isn't the easiest one but it can be so rewarding. I try to make the most of it no matter where the job takes me. I have created lasting relationships with trade contractors in almost every placement which is something I value deeply. My hopes are that will help our EV team in the long term.
