# **Extending Our Culture of Safety to the Ones We Love: CPR Training for Families**



At EV Construction, safety isn't just a tag line, it's who we are. It's the foundation of our work, and increasingly, it's becoming a value we bring home. For me, it's things like making the choice to wear safety glasses while weed whipping the yard, grabbing the ladder instead of

balancing on something nearby, or wearing ear protection when leaf blowing. I'll admit that my "pre-EV" self didn't consider, or even realize, some of the basic safety tactics I was overlooking. Today, I'm making better choices, planning through personal projects in a different way, and thinking more about the people who rely on me in situations where I could "just quickly get this done."

While proper PPE, better planning, and "Leading from the Heart" at home has become a norm outside of work, where injuries and emergencies can still occur. As many of you know, Laura and I have four kids, ages six and under. We do our best, but I'm not sure a day goes by without some kind of incident: a bump, a bruise, a cut, a sliver, a choking scare... Most of the time it's minor, but occasionally it's more serious. I remember specific moments at home, when a kid was injured, or a situation called for first aid, and I realized how much more equipped I felt to respond. It wasn't because I enjoy dealing with medical emergencies (in fact, I don't love the sight of blood), but because I had the training to stay calm, assess what was needed, and act. It struck me at the time that my wife didn't have the same preparation.

and I thought, "wouldn't it be great if she could learn what I had?"

Of course, life gets busy. Kids need watching, schedules fill up, and finding the right training session for her was hard to coordinate. For a year or so I thought, "maybe we should do some sort of training for loved ones through EV." I'm sure others are in the same boat. In recent conversations with Chris, our Director of Safety, we finally found a way to make it happen. That's why I'm especially proud of an upcoming opportunity to expand our safety culture beyond the walls of EV and into our own families: a First Aid & CPR Training on Wednesday, July 23, from 5:00–8:00 PM at the EV Warehouse.

I'll end with a quote I like: "You don't rise to the occasion; you fall to the level of your training." I hope you'll encourage your spouse, partner, or loved one to take advantage of this free training. Details can be found in the flyer included in this newsletter. Let's keep building a culture where safety doesn't stop at the jobsite— it sits at the dinner table too.

### **Thrive Together Pulse**

At this month's safety meeting, we welcomed Dr. Dale Coller from Holland Hospital Sleep Center to discuss the critical role of healthy sleep habits in our personal and professional lives. Dr. Coller emphasized that consistent, quality sleep—ideally seven to nine hours nightly—is foundational for physical health, mental clarity, and overall well-being. He shared practical sleep hygiene tips such as maintaining a consistent bedtime, limiting caffeine (energy drinks) and screen time before bed, and ensuring a cool, dark, and quiet sleeping environment. The session also covered special considerations for those who work second jobs and/or have inconsistent sleep hours, noting that disrupted sleep patterns can lead to excessive fatigue, headaches, and irritability.

#### Spotlighting Sleep Disorders and When to Seek Help:

The presentation also shed light on common sleep disorders, particularly sleep apnea and shift work disorder. Dr. Coller explained that symptoms like loud snoring, daytime fatigue, and difficulty concentrating may indicate sleep apnea which is a condition that affects millions and can lead to serious health risks if left untreated. He strongly encouraged anyone experiencing chronic sleep issues to talk with their primary care provider and consider sleep testing, if needed. The message was clear: taking sleep seriously isn't just about feeling better day-to-day—it's also about reducing workplace risks, boosting productivity, and protecting long-term health.
